About LCMO

Steeped in a legacy dating back to its founding in 1910, the Lafayette City Marshal's Office has witnessed a succession of distinguished leaders who have left an indelible mark on its storied history. The inaugural City Marshal, Felix Latiolais, laid the foundation until 1914, followed by the dedicated service of J.C. Chargois from 1914 to 1936. The mantle then passed through the hands of Rene Domingue (1936-1939), Mrs. Rene Domingue (1939-1948), Malcolm Fisher (1948-1951), C.C. Sonnier (1951-1953), Gaston Hebert (1953-1955), and Dallas Broussard (1955-1981). Notably, Earl J. "Nickey" Picard held sway for an impressive six consecutive years from 1984 to 2014, solidifying his status as the longest-serving marshal.

In 2018, the office experienced a transitional period under the interim leadership of C. Michael Hill, following the removal of Marshal Brian Pope. A transformative chapter unfolded in 2020 with the historic election of Marshal Reggie Thomas, marking the first occasion where an African American citywide official assumed the esteemed role. Inaugurated on January 8, 2021, Marshal Reggie Thomas has since redefined the trajectory of the Lafayette City Marshal's Office. His tenure has been characterized by a commitment to honor, heightened transparency, amplified community engagement, and a steadfast dedication to comprehensive training for the officers under his purview, thereby leaving an enduring legacy within the proud history of the office.





Lafayette City Marshal Reggie Thomas

Marshal Reggie Thomas, a U.S. Air Force veteran, began his policing career in 1990 with the Lafayette Police Department, holding various roles. In January 2016, he became Lafayette's Interim Chief of Police, implementing community-focused policies and obtaining the city's first police department accreditation.

After serving as Interim Chief, Reggie made history as Lafayette's first Deputy Chief of Police, focusing on force management, diversity enhancement, and anti-domestic violence policies. A graduate of the FBI National Academy and Leadership Lafayette Class XXXII, Reggie emphasizes community engagement and diverse voices in leadership.

In 2020, he further made history by becoming Lafayette City Marshal, the first African American citywide elected official in Lafayette, Louisiana.

Prior to being promoted to Lieutenant, he was assigned to the Warrant Division for 18 years and was a Task Force Officer for the United States Marshal's Violent Offender Task Force. Lieutenant Duplechin is the direct supervisor of the Warrant Division, Civil Division, Court Security, and the Training/ SRO Divisions.




CALEA Process

Awarded Grants

SRO Program

Winning Cook Team


