

Expansion of SRO Program

In a significant stride towards community safety, our School Resource Officer (SRO) program has expanded to include two more schools. We are now proudly serving Cathedral Carmel-School, Westminster Christian Academy, and Lafayette Renaissance Charter Academy Middle School and High School. This expansion reaffirms our commitment to fostering a secure educational environment and strengthening partnerships within our community.





Increased Number of Reserves


Revival of D.A.R.E. Program

We revived the Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program in Lafayette Parish schools after an absence of more than 20 years. Established Motors Unit


Giveaway of More than 1000 Backpacks
